#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course is designed for the Pennsylvania Expanded Function Dental Assistant (EFDA) and or Dental Assistant team member. Restorative procedures will be reviewed and discussed with an emphasis on more challenging techniques/cases. Matrix options, shading/layering of anterior direct composite procedures and advanced temporization techniques will be presented. EFDA duties will be reviewed as listed in the Pennsylvania Dental Law including the recent changes/educational requirements to the EFDA Scope of Practice as well as procedures delegated to dental assistants.

While this course is primarily designed for the experienced EFDA, graduates of DA/EFDA programs will also be motivated by being introduced to more advanced procedures. Since the esthetic aspect of Expanded Functions requires a commitment to life-long learning, resources will be reviewed to keep abreast of these advancements. Participants will be encouraged to share techniques for success from their own experiences in practice.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

Upon completion of the course, the DA/EFDA will be able to:

1. Review advancements of newest adhesive and composite materials and discuss direct anterior composite placement techniques.
2. Review criteria for properly placed matrix systems as well as discuss tips for success with difficult preparations/situations.
3. Review criteria for clinically acceptable provisionals and introduce improved materials including indirect mock-up techniques.
4. Review permitted and non-permitted EFDA duties as listed in the PA State Board of Dentistry including recent additions to scope of practice and educational requirements.
5. Discuss new treatment options for dentin hypersensitivity and indications for their use.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course will show the many duties and challenges a Dental Assistant would face while working in the field of Forensic Dentistry. The course will give many examples of modern day techniques used in the Identification of Human remains through patient record keeping and dental radiographs. It will resonate with the participants in exhibiting the great importance of their daily duties from record charting to the taking of accurate diagnostic impressions. They will understand their role as a team player and give them an insight to possibly, in their future, assisting with Forensic Odontologists in the wake of a disaster resulting in mass fatalities.
